NO JOBS IN NIGERIA BECAUSE INDUSTRIES ARE NOT GROWING – VC

When the MFM Digest crew came to interview the Vice-Chancellor, Prof Elijah Ayolabi, in his office on the 18th of February 2020, it turned out to be an explosive encounter that touched on numerous challenges in the education sector in Nigeria. The VC was in his factual element, responding to questions succinctly and correcting widely held misconceptions about the education sector. Asked what he thought about the growing unemployment in the country seeing that graduates are turned out in large numbers from the many universities in Nigeria, the VC took a deep breath and gave an answer that surprised everyone in his expansive office. According to him, a university is a place where people are trained to be better not necessarily to graduate and work in specified areas. He further stated that industries in Nigeria are not growing, because of that, there are no jobs in the country. Therefore, university graduates must be creative to apply all the discipline and training acquired in the university. They must be innovative and not depend on paid employment. Unfortunately, a good percentage of graduates in Nigeria expect to get paid employments upon graduation and when the jobs are not forthcoming, frustra-

tion sets in. So youths must go to universities with a mindset to come up with a new idea in their specific sector and not necessarily depend on paid employment because there

is a glaring dearth of industries in Nigeria. The VC stated that at Mountain Top University, there are vocational programs for students so that when they graduate they can fend for themselves without necessarily depending on paid employment. He stressed that Mountain Top University is determined to train independent, industrious, and self-reliant youths who will not add to the growing army of unemployed graduates in the country.

The MFM digest crew noted that discipline and freedom go side by side but asked the VC how he is able to balance both at Mountain Top University. The VC responded that no freedom is free in the final

analysis and that is why the students are given the university handbook upon admission. According to him, the university maintains a zero level tolerance for deviant attitudes like smoking, indecent dressing, and all forms of immorality. Asked if the university had any experience with students who indulged in such behaviour, the VC honestly admitted that there were minimal experiences but the university authorities try to control them without necessarily destroying the child or the university. However, some offences attract automatic expulsion on campus, for example, drugs, sexual immorality, and some others. According to him, occult activities cannot take place in the university because the students are strictly monitored 24 hours every day.

When the VC was asked to throw more light on the quality of lecturers at Mountain Top University, his response was immediate and authoritative. He explained that many people do not know much about how the university environment operates. According to him, professors did not fall from the moon. Mountain Top University is specifically grooming professors and that is far better. The university is young;

therefore, it won't be proper to engage many professors at this stage. In any case, being a professor does not make a lecturer the best. He noted that the middle-class lecturers provide a good workforce for a young university like Mountain Top University. A professor is full of grandeur and self-importance, often time involved in many administrative functions that may affect the running of the university outside his specified academic functions. But the middle-class lecturers are ready to work, they are ready to build, and ready to sacrifice their times for the growth and benefit of the university. So when they are groomed in that way to professorial level, they become a part and parcel of the university, having imbibed the values and principles of the institution.

Asked to throw more light on the permanent site of the university, the

VC's answer was revealing and informative. He pointed out that the biggest challenge with the permanent site is the Ogun River. The university management has appealed to the Ogun State government to help in re-channelling the water and it is believed that the governor will do his best in that regard. Besides the challenge of the Ogun River, the permanent site is a world-class establishment which will ultimately project the image of the university and help in achieving a state-of-the-art university environment. He pointed out that a lecture theatre is near completion and a world-class library construction by the Men of Valour (MOV) is about to commence at the permanent site. According to him, it is a gradual process but the university will surely get there.

Comparing other universities with Mountain Top University, the VC

noted that MTU is poles apart from other universities in terms of quality education, morals, environmentally friendliness and facilities. He also said that MTU's school fees are the lowest in the country. While those in Arts pay N450,000, those in Sciences pay N520,000. MTU is not a profit-based institution like many other private universities. The idea behind establishing MTU is to help humanity, help the youths, and re-write the narrative that only the rich can afford quality university education in private universities. On his achievements in the university as the principal officer, the VC maintained that he tries to do his best with the vision and abilities God has given to him stressing that any lover of excellence will agree that Mountain Top University has been driven by a God-given, divinely inspired mandate.

KOYA TRAINING FOR MTU STAFF

With these innovations and advancement MTU is set to establish her place in the league of technologically and digitally compliant institutions in Africa and around the world.

GEOSCIENCES STAFF AND STUDENTS VISIT IBESE AND ERUWA ON FIELD-WORK

In a demonstration of the core values of Mountain Top University that students should be trained in both theoretical and practical aspects of their respective disciplines, the Geosciences Department embarked on a week long trip to Dangote Cement Quarry, in Ibese, Ogun State and the crystalline basement area of Eruwa in Oyo state for a field work. The students were led by their Coordinator, Dr. James Adeoye and other lecturers, Michael Okunubi and Rotimi Peter Akinwale on the field trip so as to fully prepare the students to face the realities of their profession. The field

work took place from the 18th to 24th of February, 2020.

The essence of the field work was to teach 200 and 300 level Geophysics students how to do geological mapping, appreciate and get acquainted with in-situ fresh exposed sedimentary and crystalline rocks in Nigeria. They were also equipped with skills of exploring the nation's mineral and water resources, as well as gained knowledge on how to mitigate earth's natural hazards.
