

As the dignitaries of the day arrived and took their seats inside the posh auditorium, it was obvious that the First-Class academic and Chancellor of the university, Dr. Daniel Olukoya was unmistakably absent. However, he was ably represented by Pastor Kunle Adesanya. The Vice-Chancellor of the university, Professor Elijah Ayolabi was, however, present and made the occasion grand with his distinguished presence. Other principal officers of the university present were the Registrar Mr. Olufemi Oyewole, the Bursar Mr. Shola Olagundoye, and the University Librarian Dr. (Mrs) Helen Akinade. Also, all the deans of the university graced the occasion, Prof. Amos Akinwade, Dean College of Basic and Applied Sciences, Dr. Oladele Akinyomi, Dean College of Humanities, Management and Social Sciences, Dr. I.B Akinyemi, Dean Postgraduate School, and Dr. Moses Abiala, Dean Students' Affairs. All the HODs, Directors of different institutes and programs, staff, both academic and non-academic, were also present to witness what one of the matriculating student called the most memorable day of his life so far. Given the age of the matriculating student, the day could be his most memorable day but of course, there will be more memorable days for the young, matriculating students.

The first exciting moment of the day was when the principal officers were introduced one after another. The introduction of each of them drew wild applause from the students and staff but when the Dean of Students' affairs was introduced, the roof of the auditorium was almost brought down with thunderous cheers. It appeared that the Dean of students' affairs is very popular with the students. Whether the popularity is for admiration, indifference or mixed feelings one cannot tell but given the amiable nature and debonair disposition of the Dean, one can easily conclude that the cheers were certainly that of admiration.

When the Vice-Chancellor took the

podium to deliver the welcome address, it was greeted with thunderous cheers and applause. This time, one was not in doubt as to the mood and attitude of the audience towards the VC's graceful march to the podium. A man who has transformed a young university into a world-class citadel deserves nothing but applause. In his address, the VC chronicled the birth and growth of the university and paid tribute to the Chancellor and his wife for their insight and vision in establishing the university, sacrificing so much to see to its growth. He further welcomed the matriculating students to the university and assured them of world-class education in a world-class environment. He also assured their parents that they have made a good choice by bringing their children to the university because, besides standard education, the students will also be moulded in line with the doctrines of Christian values. Concluding his address, he fervently prayed for the students and pronounced blessings upon all of them for the period they will study in the university and beyond. To say that the address was received with claps and shouts will be an understatement. The cheers and applause lasted for more than three minutes and it took the MC a few more minutes to calm the audience down.

Representing the Chancellor, Pastor Kunle Adesanya gave a brief exulting word of the day. He read from Gen 1:27 and enjoined the audience to live a holy life that will reflect their personality as the image of God. At the end of his short speech, he prayed extensively for everyone in the auditorium especially the matriculating students.

At this time, the atmosphere of the auditorium became ecstatic with the performance of the students who came on stage to play various musical instruments. Indeed, they played the instruments with such dexterity that left the audience clapping, standing on their feet. Certainly, the university's Every Student a Musi-

cian (ESM) project is working wonders and one could feel from the way the students handled the musical instruments that they have taken to the project wholeheartedly. It was revealed that the students had made a CD which was sold at the venue of the matriculation. One wonders if the management of the university will introduce a counterpart program for members of staff (All Staff a Musician) ASM program. I am sure all members of staff will welcome this kind of initiative.

If we thought that exciting moments of the day were over, we didn't see what was going to happen next or rather, we were not expecting it. It is a tradition for the university management to call out students in the First-Class category during matriculation and appreciate them by presenting a cash award to them. This goes a long way in motivating other students towards gunning for excellence. It was all glorious when this set of students filed out amidst cheers from the audience to receive their award and a hand shake from the Vice-Chancellor. The VC also used the occasion to present tablets/mini-computers to the students. He however, announced that the Chancellor, in his magnanimity, had paid half of the price for each tablet

In his closing remarks, the Dean of College of Basic and Applied Sciences, Prof. Amos Akinwade prayed for all the students, staff, and parents who graced the occasion and challenged them to aim for the top since it was not by accident that they had come to Mountain Top University.

DR BABATUNDE ONI DELIVERS MTU UNIVERSITY LECTURE ON MEDIA LITERACY

As part of the academic programme and commitment of MTU to research and learning, a University Lecture was held at The University's Multi-purpose Hall on 23rd January, 2020. It was a great afternoon of knowledge and enlightenment as an erudite and ace scholar, Dr. Babatunde

Oni, an Associate Professor of Mass Communication at the Mountain Top University delivered an insightful and enriching lecture on a current and trendy topic: 'Media Literacy: Navigating the Perilous Labyrinth of a Media Saturated Society.' The Vice-Chancellor in his opening speech welcomed everyone at the event and encouraged them to be attentive

and focused as they are about to tap into the wealth of knowledge of the scholar on Media Literacy.

Dr. Oni during the course of his lecture, which he delivered with great dexterity and eloquence, says the Mass Media is ‘a valuable power source’ and they ‘are like weapons in the hands of whoever controls

hands of whoever controls them.’ He proceeded to say that Mass media have the power to manipulate people ‘and make them do things or refrain from doing things.’ He defined Media Literacy as “a skill for people who are at the receiving end in a media saturated society for accessing, filtering, analysing, using and (even) rejecting information.’ He went on further to explain that there are some pertinent questions individuals need to enquire on any current event portrayed by media, some of which are: ‘Who are the subjects and what are their positions? Who is covering the story? Is it mainstream, corporate media or alternative non-traditional media? Who/what are the sources? What is their motiva-

tion or interest? Who are their intended audience and through what medium are they trying to reach them?’ etc.

He concluded by submitting that Media Literacy must become part of the educational curriculum at all levels if the skill set must be acquired and applied by all. He opined that this can only be possible if educationists, teachers and trainers of young people themselves are skilled in critical media literacy. In his words, ‘If we learn to make use of media literacy skills in all our activities with the media and the people we encounter we will move closer to becoming more informed and better suited for a desirable civic engagement.’ It was indeed an exciting and enlightening evening.

- ♦ The registrar maintains that there are plans to reward excellence and professionalism among members of staff.


