MOUNTAIN TOP UNIVERSITY EMERGES FIRST IN SUB SAHARA AFRICA – IMPERIAL BARREL AWARD (IBA) 2020

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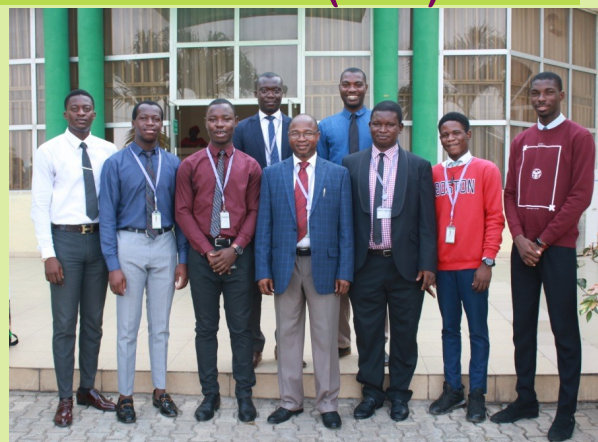
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Mountain Top University (MTU) emerged first in Sub Sahara Africa in the ongoing 2020 edition of the Imperial Barrel Award (IBA) organized by the American Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG). Below is the list of scores received by each of the seven finalists in the sub-regional round decided in Lagos on the 12th of March, 2020.

Mountain Top University, Prayer City, Ogun State and Chukwuemeka Odumegwu Ojukwu University, Uli, Anambra State, having taken 1st and 2nd place respectively, will progress to the African Region (AR) Finals to be held on the 8th of April, 2020 and coordinated from Cairo, Egypt.

The Imperial Barrel Award (IBA) was founded in 1976 by the Imperial College in the UK. It started off as an MSc Petroleum Geosciences course, where students interpret seismic from the North Sea using colour pencils. In

2007, the American Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG) adopted the program concept and expanded it to incorporate new technology, new data sets, and also include students from every country in the world to participate in the Imperial Barrel Award. The competition provides students with a unique learning experience with real data sets from around the globe.

The Geosciences Department at the Mountain Top University has proven by this feat that they have what it takes to compete with their counterparts in other parts of the world and win. However, awards and laurels are not new to the young and vibrant four-year old department. They have won the NAPE Best University Exhibitor Award twice, back to back, in 2018 and 2019 beating many universities who have been around for decades.

In an interview with MTU Editorial and Media Unit, the Coordinator of the Geosciences programme, Dr James Adeoye, expressed joy at the progress *Continued on next page*

He attributed the victory to the exemplary leadership of the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Elijah Ayolabi, who incidentally is an award-winning and globally recognized Geophysicist, having won many awards and grants in the field including the SEG Honorary Lecturer for Middle East and Africa in 2015. The commitment and hard work of the academic staff in the

The students who already see themselves as global scholars are enthu-

siastic and hopeful that the world will hear about MTU through their achievements. It is important to note that one of the students, Omisakin, Solomon, recently attended a conference in Saudi Arabia fully sponsored by IBTC through a grant he won. He expressed deep appreciation to MTU for providing the platform and an enabling environment for them to thrive and excel.

MTU GETS FULL ACCREDITATION FROM NUC

The National Universities Commission (NUC) has granted full accreditation to five academic programmes at our great citadel of learning-Mountain Top University. MTU! Empowered to excel! He explained that a Mock Accreditation was organized for the 5 programmes where five areas of accreditation contents were examined. He added that the outcome of the visitation exercise reveals outstanding results for each of the five programmes accredited with the score of 70 and above.

Ayoade Ayolabi, expressed his happiness and excitement about the NUC approval. This is a testament of his proactive leadership and resourceful management.

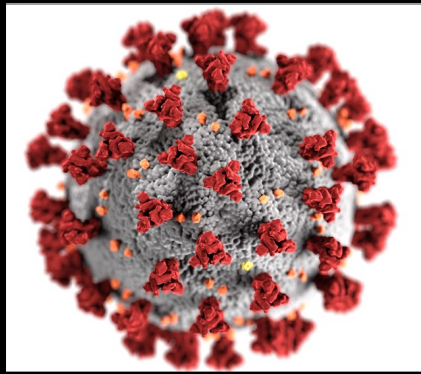

ranks to university levels. Mountain Top University, as a law abiding institution and in kind consideration of the lives of everyone within the university community, announced a one month closure from the 23rd of March to the 24th of April, 2020.

A statement from the office of the Registrar states that “As part of measures to curb the spread of the Coronavirus (Covid-19) in Nigeria and in line with the directive of the Federal and Ogun State governments, the University Management has directed staff of the University to proceed on their 2020 annual leave for a period of one (1) month beginning from Monday, 23rd March, 2020 and to resume on 24th April, 2020. Members of staff who have utilized part of their annual leave for the Year 2020 should enjoy the rest of the leave due during this break”. By the above pronouncement, the university authorities have shown empathy and care towards members of the university community. In demonstration of the kind gesture, salaries and wages for the month of March have been fully paid, even before the month ran out. Indeed, all hands of labour in the university are grateful for the kind

gesture.

One is bound to ask, does the closure of the university, like all private and public universities across the country, amount to the closure of all administrative activities? Of course, the answer is no. According to the Registrar, there is ongoing e-conferencing to manage the affairs of the university and to ensure that, although the university is on a forced break, the wheels are still running. Kudos must be given to the Vice-Chancellor, the Registrar, and all administrative staff who are involved in the daily running of the university in spite of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The success of MTU within a very short time of its establishment has provoked several debates across the country. Some people have said that the reason behind the tremendous success of the university is the divine mandate and vision handed over to the Chancellor and Visitor of the institution, Dr Daniel Olukoya, General Overseer of the Mountain of Fire and Miracles Ministries. Other people have attributed the success of the university to the visionary management by the pioneer Vice-Chancellor Professor Elijah Ayolabi. Yet many people believe that the success and growth of

the university can be attributed to the quality of committed and intelligent staff in the institution. The debate goes on and on. Whatever be the case, Mountain Top University is making progress and will continue to make progress.

While the COVID-19 pandemic rages on across the world, disrupting the regular protocol of human community, it is believed that many institutions will surely survive the debacle and when the numbers are counted, Mountain Top University, together with all the staff, will be among those that will be counted. Meanwhile, the university is not totally shut down. All management staff and their support staff are working, the security unit is working, the Health/Medical Centre is working, and Facility and Electrical Units are working. Housekeepers in the Hostels are also working. The above units may not maintain a regular work schedule, but the underlying concern is that they are all working through an effective template that will meet the demands of the university. Mountain Top University is truly empowered to excel.

BOARD OF MTU SCHOOL OF POSTGRADUATE STUDIES INAUGURATED

History was once again made in Mountain Top University (MTU) as the Vice Chancellor, Professor Elijah Adebawale Ayolabi inaugurated the Board of the University's Postgraduate School on Tuesday, 3rd March, 2020. The University recently received the permission of the National Universities Commission to initiate the process for the commencement of postgraduate programmes.

Speaking at the event, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. E. Ayolabi charged the Board to ensure timely delivery of all programmes in order to be a model postgraduate school in Nigeria, urging members to set the direction that the SPGS would go from start. He challenged the Board to work on placing the University at the forefront of research excellence in the country and beyond.

In his remarks at the event, the Ag. Dean of the School, Dr. Ibidapo Akinyemi thanked the Vice Chancellor for his doggedness which ensured the prompt approval of postgraduate studies in the University by the Senate. He expressed his delight on his appointment to pioneer the MTU Postgraduate School as Acting Dean. He further appealed for the support and coop-
