The College of Basic and Applied Sciences (CBAS) of Mountain Top University has made another giant stride in research and development as she hosts her maiden conference. The theme of the conference was **“Unforeseen COVID-19 Disruptions: Surmounting the Unintended Tension towards Economic Rejuvenation and Sustainable Development”**. The Conference was a hybrid event hosted both physically and virtually; it was held at the Mountain Top University (MTU) Multipurpose Hall and also via Zoom.

The conference was hosted by the Ag. Dean, College of Basic and Applied Sciences, Dr. Edwin Andrew Ofudje. The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Elijah A.

Ayolabi, and other Principal Officers of the University – the Registrar, Mr. Olufemi E. Oyewole; the Bursar, Mr. S. R. Olagundoye; the University Librarian, Dr. (Mrs.) Helen O. J. Akinade; Ag. Dean CBAS, Dr. Edwin A. Ofudje; Dean CHMS, Prof. John O. Akinyomi; Dean SPGS, Prof. Ibidapo O. Akinyemi; Ag. Dean, Students’ Affairs, Dr. Moses A. Abiala were present at the conference. Other members of staff, including the immediate past Dean CBAS, Prof. Ayo Olalusi and students were equally present at the conference.

The first day of the conference was done physically at the University Multipurpose Hall . The Opening Remark was given by the Special Guest of Honour, the General Overse-

er, Mountain of Fire and Miracles Ministries (MFM), Dr. Daniel Kolawole Olukoya, who is also the Chancellor of the University. The General Overseer, bringing goodwill messages, stated that the theme picked for the conference was a vital one and also very apt. He noted that COVID-19 created more problems than its advantages and as such, the storm is not yet over but he prayed that the Lord will make it pass away. Dr. Olukoya stated that there has been extreme poverty and depression, rise in price of foodstuffs, increase in substance abuse and also increase in keeping to hygiene principles and use of technology. He equally noted that the pandemic has proved that we are mere mortals. In his conclusion, the General Overseer prayed that the strange times would go away and the good times will come. He reiterated the need to think outside the box and the need to be creative. He prayed for the entire University students, staff and the Management. He was presented a plaque of recognition by the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Elijah A. Ayolabi and the Ag. Dean CBAS, Dr. Edwin A. Ofudje.

In his welcome speech, the Host, Dr. Edwin A.

Ofudje stated that the conference was an avenue to showcase the research work of the College of Basic and Applied Sciences (CBAS) and conference participants from other higher institutions. He noted that the need to nurture an environment where research can thrive was needed in the economy and that was why the theme of the conference was chosen. Dr. Ofudje affirmed that, "69 abstracts were accepted for the conference and 65% of them are from CBAS faculty members and recent graduates". In his conclusion, he appreciated the General Overseer, Dr. Daniel Kolawole Olukoya, for his spiritual and financial support and the University Management for their support.

The Chief Host of the event, the Vice-Chancellor, Mountain Top University (MTU), Prof. Elijah A. Ayolabi, in his remarks, observed that the conference brought together many intellectuals. In his speech, he reiterated that, "The emergence of COVID-19 has brought unprecedented disruptions to the society. It is a thorn in the flesh of individuals as well as corporate organizations as its impact is damaging. It has worsened the SDGs and sustainability has become very uncertain". In his remarks, Prof. Ayolabi stated that the world has reached a point to innovate and Mountain Top University is proud to host this conference which has global influence and implored the Government to mitigate the negative impact of COVID-19. In his concluding remarks, the Vice-Chancellor mentioned that he desired for the conference to create a platform for future collaborations and wished for a fruitful engagement during the 2-day conference.

The Keynote Speaker was the Vice-Chancellor, Covenant University, Ota, Prof. Abiodun Humphrey Adebayo. Prof. Abiodun Humphrey Adebayo is a member of the National Universities Commission (NUC) and a member of the governing board of African Universities. He is also a Pastor at Living Faith Church.



He spoke on the topic: **“Unforeseen COVID-19 Disruptions: Surmounting the Unintended Tension towards Economic Rejuvenation and Sustainable Development”**. In his speech, Prof. Adebayo said that the pandemic is a global one that has brought about global disruptions, fear and a lot of uncertainties; and once there is disruption, it will lead to instability to an already existing economic structure. When looking at the global impact, it resulted in travel bans and spike in urban crimes, and these worsened the economy of developing nations. According to him, “The projection of the world economy showed that the world GDP will shrink to -3% in



2020 while that of sub-Saharan Africa will shrink to -1.34% within the same period”. On the impact of COVID-19 on the SDGs, he mentioned that there are 17 SDGs and the pandemic has had an adverse impact on almost all of them, as socio-economic problems have worsened and as such Nigeria’s focus on SDGs has been greatly affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Prof. Adebayo, who is the Vice-Chancellor of Covenant University, talked about their experience at Covenant University. He stated that their academic calendar was not affected by COVID-19 disruptions as they switched to virtual learning but examinations



were done when the students returned to the campus, and as such there was a blended learning experience. He also enumerated other positive sides of the pandemic as its impact on the International Visiting Scholar (IVS) scheme as it reduced the cost of operations. Another good side of the pandemic is the partnership with Coursera which gives certificates to their students for online courses and trainings. Prof. Abiodun Humphrey Adebayo also talked about building a resilient economy for sustainable development through:

- Embracing innovative ideas
- Having shared and contextual value
- User-Centric business
- Engaging responsive economic policies

He noted that, “The new normal has brought about unintended tension for preparedness and adaption” and so made the following recommendations:

- Diversify the Economy
- Improve the industrial sector
- Fight corruption to the barest minimum
- Reduce the cost of governance

In his concluding remarks, the Keynote Speaker, Prof. Adebayo, quoting Jay Samit said, “The joy of disruption comes from accepting that we all live in a tem-

poral state". At the end of his address, he was given a plaque of recognition by the Vice-Chancellor, Mountain Top University, Prof. Elijah A. Ayolabi and the Ag. Dean CBAS, Dr. Edwin A. Ofudje.

The Guest Speaker of the day was Mr. Dave Inyere, MD/CEO, Eldin Consultants Limited, Lagos. Mr. Dave Inyere is a Fellow of the Nigeria Computer Science Association. He spoke on the topic: **"Energy and Sustainable Development in Nigeria"**. In his address, Mr. Inyere said that the Oil & Gas Sector plays a vital role in the Nigerian Economy. Nigeria is the biggest Crude Oil producing Nation in Africa and oil is responsible for 80% of its revenue. The Guest Speaker said, "Like other developing countries, Nigeria has become poorer because of the decrease in production. When there is a decrease in production, there is a decrease in revenue". He stated that some challenges of COVID-19 are the office and business closure and the decrease in oil production, while some of its opportunities include working leisurely (work from home) and increase in the use of digital platforms & applications. He made the following recommendations:

- Breaking oil dependency
- Building human capital

In his concluding remarks, the Guest Speaker, Mr. Inyere, stated that time has come for Nigeria to reset its Economy. He was also presented a plaque of recognition by the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Elijah A. Ayolabi and the Ag. Dean CBAS, Dr. Edwin A. Ofudje.

The Registrar, Mr. Olufemi E. Oyewole, gave the Vote of Thanks. He expressed gratitude to the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Elijah A. Ayolabi, for providing the enabling environment for the conference and also thanked the staff and students in attendance.

The second day of the conference was held virtually via Zoom. The Guest Speaker was the Dean and

Head of the School of Computational Sciences & Informatics, Academic City University College, Accra-Ghana, Prof. Longe Olumide. He spoke on the topic: "Pandemic Policies and Educational Legacies: Leveraging Technology to enhance Educational Learning for the Post-COVID Era". In his speech, Prof. Olumide stated that COVID-19 has some negatives but at the same time it has brought some positive results. Prof. Olumide noted that containment issue is primal to seeking alternative platforms for learning, while the new adjustment entails adopting remote and technological learning. Lessons from the 2008 recession show that relying on layoffs to balance institutional budgets is the fastest way to kill innovation, risk-taking and morale. Prof. Olumide, in his concluding remarks, noted that blended learning would dramatically increase. Online degrees and certificates will earn additional credibility. School administrators and Heads of Departments will understand that online learning is a new source of revenue. The world will not remain the same after COVID-19, so is the global educational teaching and learning landscape. He was presented a plaque of recognition by the Ag. Dean CBAS, Dr. Edwin A. Ofudje and the Ag. Director, Centre for Research, Innovation and Collaboration (CRIC), Dr. O. E. Fayemi.

There were also break out technical sessions on both days of the conference during which scholarly presentations were made by the participants. The conference was attended by a total of 89 registered participants from thirteen different higher institutions of learning including students and working class participants. In all, the conference was hugely successful and a good boost to the rising profile of the College, while hoping that the success story will be sustained.

MTU Resumes for the 2021/2022 Academic Session

After six weeks break, Mountain Top University announced the resumption of academic activities for the 2021/2022 academic session. The new session commenced on the 18th of October with the resumption of fresh students, while the old students are expected back on campus on the 1st of November.

Kill the Silent Killers

Sicknesses, infirmities, diseases and exposure to injurious-to-health environmental chemicals and toxins take time to progress to detrimental stages, if unchecked. So in medical practice, we usually talk about natural history of a disease or environmental toxin in the body - that is, from the time one gets exposed, its course and outcome .

This article is written with the aim of re-awakening us to "health-related silent killers" and how to kill them. These silent killers include:-

a) Hypertension (High Blood Pressure): According to the result of a study carried out by Imperial College, London and World Health Organization (WHO); there are more than 700 million people with untreated hypertension worldwide and the number of adults aged 30-79 years who has high blood pressure has increased from 650 million to 1.28 billion in the last 30 years. NEARLY HALF OF THESE PEOPLE DID NOT KNOW THEY HAD HYPERTENSION.

Hypertension can easily be detected through measuring Blood Pressure at home or in a health centre. It is easily treated with low-cost medicines, yet more than half of the people with high blood pressure do not receive the treatment that they need.

Hypertension significantly increases the risk of heart, brain and kidney diseases, and is one of the top causes of death and disease throughout the world. It is a contributory factor as an underlying medical condition complicating Covid-19 treatment, recovery and eventual deaths.

The big question is: HAVE YOU HAD YOUR

BLOOD PRESSURE CHECKED LATELY?

b) High Blood Glucose: The medical condition called Diabetes Mellitus, arises from successive checks of the Blood Glucose of an individual, and if high - on different occasions - will warrant treatment by a medical practitioner. Treatment options include lifestyle modifications with medications.

Persistent uncontrolled elevated blood glucose silently damages the eyes; the kidneys; the nerves; causes heart diseases; and is a leading cause of brain disease and its attendant complications. In this era of COVID-19, diabetes complicates treatment, recovery and deaths in COVID-19 patients.

The big question is: HAVE YOU HAD YOUR BLOOD GLUCOSE CHECKED LATELY ?

c) High Blood Lipids: Blood cholesterol and other lipids when elevated constitute a danger, if unchecked over time. What I have found out in practice is that many people out there tend to downplay or have very little awareness on the issue of Blood Lipids, but rather put more emphasis on Blood Pressure and Blood Glucose checks. Uncontrolled, elevated blood lipids cause hardening and thickening of blood vessels, leading to heart and blood vessels diseases . It also leads to build-up of fats in the Liver - this is deleterious to the normal functioning of the Liver.

The big question is: HAVE YOU HAD YOUR BLOOD LIPIDS CHECKED LATELY?

d) Occupational Stress: Believe it or not , Stress depresses your immunity (defence against diseases). Many ailments - communicable and non-communicable diseases, have the "wear and tear" of

work-related stress as a contributory factor to the manifestation of these diseases, including our present-day enemy - COVID-19.

The big question is: HOW ARE YOU COPING WITH OCCUPATIONAL STRESS? Do go over my previous article in the University electronic bulletin, titled - *Stressed? Don't Buckle under the Strain/Pressure*. This you can find on pages 11-12 of the March, 2021 edition.

e) Poor Sleep Quality/Sleep Deprivation: The whole system of your body - that is, Central Nervous, Respiratory, Musculoskeletal, Digestive, Reproductive, Urinary, and the Special Senses viz your Eyes, Ears, Nose, Tongue and Skin, will be better coordinated for optimum SPIRITUAL, PHYSICAL and MENTAL PERFORMANCE - when you have a regular GOOD SLEEP-AT-NIGHT PATTERN.

The big question is: HAS SLEEP AT BEDTIME BECOME DIFFICULT FOR YOU? Do go over my previous articles in the University e-bulletin titled - *Sleep Your Brain Younger I & II* (October 2020 & November 2020 editions).

How to Kill the Silent Killers

- ◆ Ensure you do a regular check of your Blood Pressure, Blood Glucose and Blood Lipids. If you don't check, how will you know there is a problem!
- ◆ Medical Advice from your Doctors will serve as a guide on best approach to treatment options best suited for you, that is, if you have health challenges that border on Blood Pressure, Blood Glucose and Blood Lipids.
- ◆ If you have been commenced on drugs to regu-

late your Blood Pressure, Blood Glucose and Blood Lipids, DO NOT STOP USING YOUR MEDICATIONS ON YOUR OWN VOLITION without agreeing with your Doctors.

- ◆ Cigarette/Tobacco/illicit drugs/Smoking and Alcohol intake must be stopped immediately as it will continue to compound and worsen your Blood Pressure, Blood Glucose and Blood Lipids control. In addition, smoking and alcohol intake constitute a grave danger to health by causing all FORMS OF CANCER, heart, liver, lungs, brain, sudden collapse and deaths.
- ◆ You must watch what you eat, when to eat, where to eat and how you eat. You must combine the use of your medications with dietary, exercise and body weight adjustments - in order to kill high blood pressure, high blood glucose and high blood lipids.
- ◆ Do not be overwhelmed by work-related stress.
- ◆ Make deliberate and conscious efforts to sleep soundly at night, especially after a hectic day or work schedule.
- ◆ "Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand." - Philippians 4:5
- ◆ Above all, pray to our Father in Heaven - JEHOVAH RAPHA - THE LORD OUR HEALER - for DIVINE HEALING and RESTORATION.

In summary, take charge of your health. DO NOT LEAVE YOUR HEALTH ON THE ALTAR OF CHANCE, PROBABILITY AND PERMUTATIONS.
